The Battle of Trafalgar

The Battle of Trafalgar in 1805 was one of the fiercest naval battles in British maritime history. It pitted the British fleet of 27 ships against the combined might of the French and Spanish, whose fleet consisted of 33 ships.

- Britain and France had been at odds with each other for years. Napoleon Bonaparte of France wanted to take control of the English Channel so he could invade Britain. However, the British navy was the dominant force in the oceans and Napoleon knew he would have to overcome this threat to have any chance of victory. Napoleon also knew he'd have to best Admiral Horatio Nelson, who was the leading figure in the British navy and was considered a tactical genius.
- 10 One of the tactics Nelson used to stop France attacking Britain was blocking the French ships from sailing out of their ports. However, when a storm struck the coast, some French ships took advantage of the conditions and evaded the British ships that were standing guard. The French ships met up with their Spanish allies and eventually headed to Cádiz, Spain. Under pressure from Napoleon, who was
- 15 on the European mainland at the time, the Franco-Spanish fleet left Cádiz soon afterwards. To their dismay, Nelson intercepted them off the cape of Trafalgar*, and the Battle of Trafalgar commenced.

- The fleets fought ferociously. Cannonballs blasted through the air, demolishing everything in their path and leaving gaping holes in ships' sides that billowed with
- 20 smoke. The deafening sound of gunfire was heard all around as the bullets ripped through the ships' sails and reduced them to tatters. After an exceptionally vicious battle, the British were victorious — amazingly, the British didn't lose a single ship, while the Franco-Spanish fleet lost many. However, this resounding victory was soured somewhat for the British, as Nelson lost his life during the battle.

* the cape of Trafalgar — *an area of Spanish land that sticks out into the sea*
